This document will contain information & the latest details for the British team fencers & coaches travelling to the junior & cadet World Championships in Belfast, 4-13 April 09. Please read all of it carefully. **You should print a copy on the day before you leave & bring it with you.**

Information & Communication

For email notification of each change to the information about this event **you should subscribe to the “Junior & Cadet World Championships 2009, Belfast” thread** at www.fencingforum.com, make sure you have “Instant Email Notification” selected as the Default Thread Subscription Mode on the Edit Options tab in the User CP. **If you don't know what all this means ASK.**

Administration here in the UK is being done by the Team Managers (Neil Brown [Chef de Mission] & Linda Strachan [Team Manager]), Nosheen Khan & your weapon captain/coach. **Please copy Neil & Linda in all email correspondence & Nosheen in any that are about funding** (emails are nosheen.khan@britishfencing.com & you should know your weapon captain's email).

You must fill in & return the permission form & the 1-line spreadsheet now. There is a copy at the end of this letter & you *cannot* fence in the event unless I have this signed by you (& a parent for U18s). I need information to be returned from all fencers including the non-travelling reserve cadet fencers.

Organised travel will be out and back in 2 groups. Information from the completion, 1st April 09:-

X - Organisation of the Direct Elimination Table to the Final

The table of 32 of the individual events will take place entirely on the 4 coloured pistes which are equipped for video-refereeing. In the table of 32, wireless equipment will be used in all weapons. Fencers must have their own special conductive t-shirts for foil and sabre. Please note these are different, those used for foil must not be used at sabre and those used for sabre must not be used for foil. For epee, fencers require a conductive cuff on their fencing arm. The cuff will be supplied by the wireless technicians.

- 1) The fencers who have won bouts of the table of 64 must immediately go to the Call Room and submit their equipment to the L32 Weapon Control for checking.
- 2) Fencers must present themselves at the Call Room at least 20 minutes before their scheduled bout for fitting of wireless equipment.
- 3) Special areas, defined by barriers, are assigned to coaches around the coloured pistes. They are only allowed to leave these areas during the 1 minute break.
- 4) A special protocol is applied from the table of 32. The fencers, in full fencing attire, are escorted with the referees from the call room to their respective pistes. After the first round of the table of 32, the bouts take place one after the other as soon as pistes become available, as long as the bouts do not start more than 5 minutes before the official schedule.
- 5) The SEMI delegate will give the weapons in a **closed** fencing bag to the volunteers, who will escort the athletes to the coloured pistes. The fencing bag will remain closed during the entire combat. The athletes will leave the call room ready to fence, with mask in hand. Upon reaching the piste they will immediately select a weapon from the bag and move to the centre of the piste.

Initial seeding for cadet events

- 1) **Initial cadet classification criteria for cadet competitions:**
When drawing pools in the World Cadet Championships, the order of strength is established according to the following criteria:
 1. The top 8 in the previous year's World Cadet Championship (classification number = actual rank)
 2. The 64 highest ranked in the official FIE junior ranking (classification number =100+ actual rank)
 3. Those placed 9-32 in the previous year's World Cadet Championship (classification number = 200+ actual rank)
 4. Those placed 65 onwards in the official FIE junior ranking (classification number = 300+ actual rank)
 5. Criteria according to the DT's decision:

Any fencers not using these flights *must* arrive with at least a clear day before their event (for preparation & weapon control) & should not leave until at least the day after their event. Note: you must travel with the British team on the transport we organise or with a parent or guardian. Please make sure you are clear when you are joining & leaving the trip.

Please note all enquiries about travel should be directed to Neil & Linda, please check that I (Neil) have got the details on the web site updated correctly. Note: British Fencing or your weapon captain will be responsible for booking travel for the fencers & the officials only, we are not responsible for booking travel or hotels for personal coaches or parents.

While at the event we will have the use of a mini-bus, just for the British team. Drivers will be Neil, Linda, Sue & Ian.

Airport transfer

All fencers who are making their own travel arrangements are responsible for getting to the hotel or agreed meeting point. If you need us to book airport transfers these will cost £17.50 per person (return). Check the spreadsheet if you have asked for this.

Important Documents

You need a valid full British Passport. Without this you will not be allowed to enter the competition. It is your responsibility to have this with you. You must have an FIE licence & a British Fencing licence & **bring them with you.**

Each fencer and their parent/guardian will need to sign the Consent / Medical form giving permission to travel with the British Team. This also sets out the terms under which the team will operate and contact phone numbers for emergency. **This form should be completed and returned to me by post as soon as you can. Please make sure you have read the bit that says there will be no drinking alcohol at all, this will also apply to all the officials who are supervising the trip or have accreditation.**

- **Parents who are in the same hotel or who are eating with the fencers should respect this & not drink any alcohol in the company of fencers or British Fencing officials. If you do not want to conform we politely request you please stay or eat somewhere else.**

You need a digital photo for accreditation, **please send this to me;** this should be a passport-style .jpg file.

Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE)

If you are undergoing any medical treatment you will need supplies of any (permitted) essential medicines together with written details, as these will have to be declared under anti-doping regulations. If in doubt please contact Dr Clare Halsted at clarehalsted@blueyonder.co.uk for advice and TUE forms. You need to bring an EHIC card with you & a valid TUE form. See http://www.britishfencing.com/British_Fencing.asp?PageID=105 for the latest information from British Fencing & you should all know about www.100percentme.co.uk, www.didglobal.com & <http://www.wada-ama.org/en/>.

Please note that there are new regulations for TUE forms from 1st Jan 09. Anyone taking medication for asthma may need to provide details of lung function tests from a doctor in order to complete a TUE, if this is relevant to you please start the process now.

Suitable travel insurance cover is obligatory, not all policies will cover you for fencing if that is the purpose of the trip or cover you for delayed travel because of drug-testing, **check.** If you

already have travel and medical insurance valid for the period for this trip you **must tell me in writing** (email is OK). If you do not have this cover already please organise it now.

Equipment & clothing

- Your fencing kit: (all fencers obviously need FIE equipment {800N jacket, breeches, & plastron, 1600N mask, S2000 blades for sabre & FIE blades for foil & epee}). Your lame {mask, jacket, overlay/glove} must be in very good condition; you should have 3 weapons & 3 body wires. Ask your coach if you are unsure about any of your equipment.
- As most of you will know the weapon control at a major championships is stricter than at any other event, all your kit must be in very good condition. This is your responsibility, there will be no armourer travelling with the British team.
- If you have a visor mask the date stamp on the visor must be dated within the last 2 years.
- It goes without saying that all your kit must be clearly labelled with your name & GBR.
- You need to have your name & GBR on the back of your jacket.
- You must have GBR stripes on your kit & all fencers must use the latest version of the GBR stripes. You can see this at <http://www.fie.ch/download/homepage/fr/Logos%20des%20tenues%20FN.pdf> & buy them from Leon Paul, Battling or Allstar UK http://www.britishfencing.com/British_Fencing.asp?PageID=96. All fencers need stripes down full length both legs of breeches, foilists & epeeists must have stripes full length on the back arm only. All fencers must have socks which are mainly white with a small manufacturer's logo, i.e. not large adidas stripes.

All fencers in any weapon (e.g. men's foil) must have the same colour kit (i.e. electric jackets, clothing with coloured panels). Masks are not part of the national uniform so do not have to be identical. After very lengthy discussions I have had over past years at the junior & cadet world championships with all the relevant FIE officials & 2 manufacturers this was interpreted as: Leon Paul or PBT lightweight material is officially the same colour as the standard silver as sold by most manufacturers, i.e. the colour is happenstance because of the material, it's not dyed to be a different colour. If a fencer has a jacket which is dyed, e.g. blue or pink, they must be the same for all fencers in that weapon. We can only assume this is the rule that will be applied at these championships.

What is important about the Leon Paul lightweight electric jackets is that the name printing is often too faint to pass the control. If you've got one of these you should take a dark blue marker pen with you.

Socks must be, according to the rules "of identical design". At some world championships recently this has been interpreted to mean completely identical, i.e. same brand with matching logos. Please can all 4 fencers in each weapon contact each other & agree what socks you will take. If you can't agree let me know I will tell you which manufacturer to buy from, bear in mind you're all competing on 2 days.

At recent major championships these FIE rules about identical equipment were not strictly enforced. However, we must travel with the expectation they will be this year.

Transparent masks are compulsory for sabre at all stages of the event & optional for foil & epee.

There will be wireless sabre & foil from the last-32 onwards (confirmed for sabre & foil, probable for epee) so sabre & foil fencers will need to have a conductive t-shirt or to have a firm plan who you will borrow one from. *Wireless t-shirts are different for foil & sabre*. Epee fencers do not need their own, STM will provide conductive sleeve cuffs for.

There will be video refereeing.

Please bear in mind you will have to hand in your equipment to weapon control the day before your event, this means if you want to train that day you will need to bring 2 sets of kit with you.

As you may know Leon Paul are supplying discounted equipment. They will give 20% discount to all selected fencers & there will be a special deal on custom-printed bags & holdalls. Details & order form are at the end of this information document. Orders must be with Leon Paul by Tuesday 10th March 09.

Allstar UK have also agreed to offer a 20% discount to all team fencers for this event. They will also supply custom printed bags for those who want them.

Maggie Lloyd-Jones will produce a t-shirts order form. There is a copy at the end of this information document. These orders must be with Maggie by at the latest.

British team Tracksuits

Fencers & coaches must wear their British team tracksuit when competing, training or supporting at the venue. Obviously the weapon coaches should make sure the fencers do this although we don't anticipate any problems.

Please DO NOT wear your GB tracksuit anywhere except the venue & hotel.

Tracksuits can be ordered directly from the British Fencing office. All fencers must have a British team tracksuit. These cost £55 but will be supplied at no charge to selected fencers who do not have one.

Discipline/Team Management

All fencers must be absolutely clear at what point they become part of the trip & when they leave it at the end. For those travelling on the flights organised by Linda it is at the airport; for those travelling independently to Belfast you need to agree meeting & departure points with one of the team officials. Fencers must be clear that the British Fencing team officials are then in charge from the point of arrival until the end of the trip.

On a daily basis once in Belfast, individual fencers will be under the direction of the appropriate Weapon captain/coach and he/she will organise training and other activities. I will be in overall charge (as Chef de Mission) Linda & I will be the lead managers and any problem will be referred to us. Lorraine Rose will be in charge of welfare (i.e. will be assisting me & Linda & the coaches with team management), she may be your first point of contact for any problems you may have, fencing or non-fencing related.

All members of the team must be aware that even after they have finished their own competition other members of the team will still have their competitions to come. Anything that interferes with any other fencer's preparation for their competition will not be tolerated.

Coaches and other officials

All people in a position of authority on this trip need:-

- to be members of British Fencing
- to have completed and submitted a CRB (Criminal Records Bureau) form to British Fencing
- to have done a sports coach UK Safeguarding & Protecting Children workshop in the past 3 years

All coaches whether personal or official will need to be on the British Fencing register of coaches. You must have a *British Fencing* CRB clearance but coach registration is done by each home country federation. **Coaches will not be able to have accreditation without this.**

A list of the fencers & officials travelling on this trip can be seen on the web page. Welfare officers / assistant team managers will be: Neil Brown, Linda Strachan, & Lorraine Rose.

All team officials & coaches must now sign & return the coaches code of conduct. These have been emailed as an attachment to all officials & coaches on the accreditation list.

Personal Coaches

As most people will be aware British Fencing appoints an official weapon coach and / or Team Captain for the championship in each particular weapon. That person is in charge of the weapon team and has the full authority of British Fencing to organise training schedules and other issues for the benefit of the team and all members of the team are required to accept this discipline. Personal coaches will also be under the direction of each weapon coach.

There is a limit to the number of officials/coaches who are allowed to have British team accreditation. This limit is set by the FIE but we will try to add any fencer's personal coaches to the list. Coaches must be on the British Fencing coaches register to be accredited.

We would encourage all personal coaches to make the effort to travel to this, our home world championships, to see fencing at the highest level. The best way to see the fencing at close range is to volunteer to help at the event. Details at <http://www.worldfencing2009.com/english-eng/volunteer-information>

These coaches will not be allowed to work with the British team unless they are on the coaches register however. Anyone who is doing anything with the British team must accept the authority of the team management & lead coaches.

Parents, Relatives and Supporters

It is not unusual for the people who have been supporting a fencer all year to wish to attend major championships and support the British team. This support is very welcome and the more vocal it is at critical parts of the competition the better. We would request however that parents and other camp followers do their utmost not to interfere with the focus of the fencer in the preparation for the competition and similarly not to interfere with the smooth running of the team after your particular competition; your fencer may have duties to assist the preparation of other fencers in the British Team.

If you are a parent travelling to Belfast remember you are there for the benefit of the fencers. If you are not sure what to do ask me, one of the officials, or your child's coach.

Please bear in mind that if you are at the event as a parent you will not be allowed to be responsible for any other fencers apart from your own children unless you have CRB clearance from British Fencing & have done a sports coach UK Safeguarding & Protecting Children course. (It would be helpful if all those of you who travel with your children regularly do both of these.) Any parents who travel with the British team should do these.

Event volunteers

Volunteers Needed for Belfast 2009 - 22 March 2009

Northern Ireland Fencing is in very great need of your support for the upcoming junior world championships in April (2nd-13th).

The world championships represent the highest standard of fencing to be seen in UK in the last 40 years and it will be the last time that NI will ever have the opportunity of hosting such an important and prestigious event or for you as fencers to be involved.

NIFU has run into a very serious shortage of volunteers for the up coming fencing event. In order for you to appreciate the scale of volunteer force needed and how much we desperately need your help, we require approximately 80 people a day for 12 days, which in real terms is more like 400 people giving two 2 days volunteer support each. Volunteers must be 16+ yrs and older.

Please have a look at the event web site & go to volunteer information, as you will see there are a number of roles available, but they for the most part do not require a high degree of skill, simply a willingness to help and some time to spare.

Code of Conduct, swordmark forms & information

Behaviour

This event is clearly not a holiday. It is a serious excursion to an elite level of competition. We expect fencers to do everything in their power to get the best result possible. This includes getting a good night's sleep before the event, eating and drinking sensibly in preparation for the event, presenting with all their kit in good working order, warming up sensibly before the event and again before each round as appropriate.

Fencers must remember that they represent Great Britain, as well as themselves, their coach and their families.

As the FIE Rules for competitions say: by taking part in a competition, you pledge your honour to observe the regulations, obey orders, abide by the decisions of the Referees, be respectful and behave in an orderly, courteous and sporting manner.

Remember that there is a procedure laid down in the rules in the event of a dispute with referees or organisers, the officials are there to argue on your behalf if necessary.

If you wish to take part in the trip.

1. If you wish to be part of this trip the first thing you must do is confirm this by email then check the spreadsheet to make sure I have all the information.
2. You & if U18 your parent/guardian/carer must sign & return the attached medical details and permissions form.
3. **Inform your local newspaper about your selection to fence as part of the GB team.**













If you do not wish to take part in this trip.

1. If you do not wish to fence in this event you must contact me by email immediately to let me know.

British Fencing Code of Conduct For fencers on all junior & cadet trips

The Code of Conduct lasts from point of entry onto the trip until point of exit from the trip.

As a member of British Fencing I agree that:
